Overview

Salivary gland cancer may involve two primary glands: Parotid gland, the largest of the salivary glands in the upper portion of each cheek, close to the ear, with ducts that empty into the upper inside of the cheek. Submandibular glands, in the floor of the mouth with ducts that empty near the lower front teeth.
