




2019 SPRING: Open to Patients

This approach – in which UCSF is a world leader – tailors care based on a detailed understanding of each individual's biology and life circumstances.

Creating the PCMB is especially urgent now, at a time when there have been extraordinary advances in cancer diagnosis and treatment. Our patients deserve timely access to these advances that include:

- High throughput genetic testing of each tumor and imaging modalities that enable us to more precisely visualize tumor margins and activity to facilitate safer and more individualized treatment options.
- Radiation oncology innovations that enhance the eradication of cancer cells while better preserving normal tissue.
